



## About the College:

Ramkrishna Nagar, situated in a remote corner in the district of Karimganj, Assam, falls under the jurisdiction of Ratabari LA-I (Reserved) and MP-I Karimganj (Reserved) constituency. The demography of the land comprises SC, ST, OBC, MOBC, EX-TGL and minority community. The natural beauty of the land is enhanced by the surrounding hilly tracts with the lush green tea gardens on the outskirts which add to its grandeur and beauty.

Ramkrishna Nagar College is located at a distance of 55 kms, from District Headquarter. It is situated on a 36 Bigha hilly tract of land, donated by the neighbouring Higher Secondary School, Ramkrishna Vidyapith. The College came into being on 12<sup>th</sup> January 1964, by the zealous efforts of a Steering committee, led by Late B. N. Mukherjee, former Minister of Health, Government of Assam. This endeavour was also augmented by the sincere help and co-operation of dedicated educationists, elites and patrons of the locality, and ultimately this lighthouse of learning came into existence— the only premier institution of Higher Education in LA 1 Lok Sabha Ratabari Constituency. The college was subsequently brought under Deficit Grant-in-Aid system in 1974, by the sincere efforts of Late Suranjan Nandi, former Minister, Government of Assam. Later on it was included under Government provincialization Act 2005. Initially the College was affiliated to Gauhati University and in 1994 was affiliated to Assam University Silchar. By the untiring efforts of the then Principal Dr. Krishna Ranjan Paul the college was finally registered under Section 2 (f) and 12B of the UGC Act 1956.

A preview of the history of the college shows that in the past many eminent personalities and educationists adorned the seat of the Principal of the college and made their contributions to the overall development of the college. The College witnessed a golden period in its history of progression with the assumption of the office of the Principal, by Dr. Krishna Ranjan Paul in 1998. During his tenure multi-dimensional activities got underway, and the college became the focal point of various accomplishments. From the academic perspective new departments such as Philosophy, Sociology, and Hindi were opened and new faculty members along with a large number of non-teaching staff was recruited. Honours Courses in Economics, Mathematics and Physics were opened for the first time. The students' enrolment strength now became enhanced, as there were more new options for them to opt for in their pursuance of higher studies. With the increased number of students coming from extremely remote villages, the need for girls' hostel became a necessity. To meet this social demand, two Girl's hostels were opened under the dynamic leadership of Dr. Paul. This was a great achievement as many students were accommodated in the hostel in an environment of perfect ambience under the warden ship of Miss Rekha Paul.



National and State Level Seminars were also held for the first time, which saw the participation and deliberations of scholars and academicians of International and National repute. A 3 day National Integration Camp was held in the college premises which witnessed the participation of Defence Personnel from all over India. This added to the glory of the College. The Study Centre of Krishna Kanta State Open University was now opened, being the first in the Barak Valley.

The infrastructural resources of the college were maximized during this period with the setting up of playgrounds, tennis – court and gymnasium for the students and the foundation stone for the outdoor –indoor stadium was laid. The NERDP too provided support with infrastructure, books etc. The Library was upgraded and for the first time, since its inception the college received the first UGC grant for the purchase of Text Books, References, Journals etc. As a result volumes of books including the Encyclopaedia Britannica (all volumes) were now purchased for library users. The number of magazines, periodicals, journals that were in circulation was increased in manifolds. Many national and international journals and newspapers were also available in the college library. Remarkable was the fact that an AC Reading room was constructed adjacent to the library, for the students with sitting capacity of a hundred seat, and an enormous rounded table and chairs etc were made of the valuable Sagun wood for the users. !

As regards computers and e-facilities, it was during this period that Internet connectivity under the aegis of INFLIBNET, (Ahmedabad), was started. Many numbers of computers were procured and both the teaching and non-teaching staff was provided with computer training. A Computer Education Centre was now opened which was inaugurated by the then Vice Chancellor, AUS Dr, Subhas Chandra Saha. Mr. Dipankar Paul Lecturer (Physics Department) was placed as the in-charge of the Center. A course in Functional English was started with Dr. Mala Sharma (HoD English) as the Co-ordinator and Mr Arunabha Bhattacharjee Lecturer as the joint Co-ordinator. Remedial Coasching Centre was also started during this period to provide extra care to the students who were unable to cope up with regular studies. A Career Advancement Scheme sponsored by UGC was launched during this period. Free laptops were provided to the Faculties of major departments and Minor Research Projects were undertaken by a number of faculty members.

A memorial Dilip Green Park commemorating the deaf and dumb Grade IV staff was also set up which conveyed the message of love of the authority for the physically challenged person who had dedicated his life to this institution. Amongst other unparalleled introductions mention may be made of the procurement of a large Generator, construction of College Gate, and a free College Bus to provide service to the students travelling long distances to reach the college on time. A Canteen was also set up to provide quality food at a reasonable price for the students as well as the members of the College Parivar

As regards the opening of Science stream in the college mention may be made here of the educationist, elites and intellectuals of Ramkrishna Nagar who came forward enthusiastically and extended their helping hand to Dr. Paul in this noble venture. Special mention may be made of the dedication of Mr Arun Dey Rtd teacher department of mathematics, Ramkrishna Vidyapith in this regard. For the first time separate science labs—Physics, and Chemistry were set up and with the Science Faculty classes in the Science Department started in full swing. The buildings of the college were adorned with names such as: GITANJALI, MALONCHO, NOTORAJ, ARUNI, UDOYON, ASHMITA, ANNAPURNA, DODHICHI, NILACHAL, etc.

On 16<sup>th</sup> September 2004, a new glorious chapter in the history of Ramkrishna Nagar College was opened. On that day, the college was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, an autonomous institution of the UGC, Govt. of India, for 5 years. The college earned the distinction of Grade 'B' scoring 73.05% of accreditation under the able guidance of Dr Krishna Ranjan Paul as the chairman, and co-ordinated by Dr. Mala Sharma Hod English as well as the other IQAC members. Today the Re-accreditation process is in progress'. Thus the college has moved ahead with the full support extended by UGC, MHRD, NERDP, Assam Govt., the valued guardians and the elites of this area.

To carry on this great legacy forward has become an enormous challenge as unfortunately the college today has become over burdened with law-suits. But with an attitude of positivism, determination and commitments the college fraternity is confident that a bright future awaits us all for as the saying goes "Every Cloud has a Silver Lining". Let us all join hands for a bright future ...And the rest are in the hands of God!

Admission to H.S. (Arts) and T.D.C. (Arts & Science) courses will be held in the **Online Mode**. This is subject to the approval of the Admission Committee of the college. The Admission Committee sets the guidelines for admission into different classes and streams and thereby reserves the right to accept or reject any admission form. However, a certain percentage of seats in all streams and courses is reserved for SC/ST/OBS/MOBC, as per Govt. Reservation Policy.

**\*The following mechanisms have been suggested by the Admission Committee for admission in different courses:**

**PASS COURSE:** Recommendation of the concerned department taking into the academic records of the candidates.

**HONOURS COURSE:** Recommendation of the concerned department on the basis of the academic records and personal interview of the candidates.

- **Admission will be given on the basis of availability of the seat capacity of respective departments.**
- **For admission, preference will be given to the students who completed their H. S. Course in regular mode.**
- **Undertaking from parents / guardians in regard to admission is compulsory.**
- **The decision of the Admission Committee in relation to the admission matter is final.**



**\*ADMISSION will be offered strictly on merit basis. However, any change with regard to the admission criteria will be notified in accordance with the time to time order of the State Government.**

Class Attendance shall be calculated on the basis of actual number of classes held during each semester in each course / paper. Number of decimal be rounded off to next higher number (e.g., 74.01% be round off to 75%)

A student with **less than 75% of attendance** on an average of all the papers (excluding NCP course, if any) of the concerned semester shall **NOT** be allowed to appear in that ESE but will be allowed to take admission in the immediate next higher semester. However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar ESE (odd / even) in all the papers and, marks to be awarded CCA for each paper shall be the marks previously secured by the student in the concerned paper, only if the student secures Pass marks in the Unit Test else he / she shall have to appear in Unit Test/s in the concerned paper along with the regular students.

### **Mark Sheets of CCA:**

The HoD shall submit the Mark Sheets of CCA as per the University Format under his/her seal and signature of the Principal of the college. Once awarded by the concerned department, the marks under CCA shall be the final and binding to all concerned.

### **Announcement by the Principal:**

The Principal of the college with recommendation of the HoD/s shall announce the names of all students of the following categories along with the notification to be published by the Principal for submission of Examination Forms:

1. Who shall NOT be eligible to appear in any paper of an ESE due to non-fulfillment of minimum attendance;
2. Who failed to pass CCA in any paper of an ESE – Including the Paper Code/s of the concerned paper/s.

Mark Sheets of CCA of each semester shall be dispatched to the University by Colleges for the concerned semester in the prescribed format as per Notification issued by COE, AUS.

### **Different components and distribution of marks for Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):**

#### **Full Marks & Pass Marks for CCA (Unit Test + Attendance)**

Courses with Only Theory paper:

Full marks = (Unit Test: 20 + Attendance: 10) = 30 (thirty)

Pass Marks = 12 (twelve)

Courses with both Theory & Practical papers:

Full marks = (Unit Test: 14 + Attendance: 36) = 20 (twenty)

Pass Marks = 08 (eight)

#### **Unit Test:**

Maximum marks:

Courses with only Theory paper = 20 (twenty);

Courses with both Theory & Practical papers = 14 (fourteen);

The HoD shall maintain a register recording the marks secured by students in all the Unit Test in each paper under his/her department.

A student who failed to secure minimum pass marks in CCA of a paper shall NOT be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of the End Semester Examination (ESE). However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar semester (Odd/even) as an Arrear Paper with the condition that:

1. He/she will appear in the Unit Test/s of the concerned paper along with the regular students and to secure minimum pass marks;
2. He/she will appear with such number of Arrear Papers in similar ESE (Odd/Even).

- Continuous support and guidance from career and counselling cell


