

About the College:

Ramkrishna Nagar, situated in a remote corner in the district of Karimganj, Assam, falls under the jurisdiction of Ratabari LA-I (Reserved) and MP-I Karimganj (Reserved) constituency. The demography of the land comprises SC, ST, OBC, MOBC, EX-TGL and minority community. The natural beauty of the landscape is enhanced by the surrounding hilly tracts with the lush green tea gardens on the outskirts which add to its grandeur and beauty.

Ramkrishna Nagar College came into being on 12th January 1964. The untiring efforts of a Steering committee, led by Late B. N. Mukherjee, former Minister of Health, Govt. of Assam, supplemented by the sincere help and co-operation from dedicated educationists, elites and patrons of the locality, brought this seat of learning into existence. It was brought under Deficit Grant-in-Aid system in 1974, by the sincere efforts of Late Suranjan Nandi, former Minister, Govt. of Assam, subsequently the college was included under provincialization Act 2005.

Ramkrishna Nagar College is located at a distance of 55 km, from District Headquarter. It is situated on a 36 Bigha hilly tracts of land, donated by the neighbouring Higher Secondary School, Ramkrishna Vidyapith. The buildings of the college are adorned with names such as: GITANJALI, MALONCHO, NOTORAJ, ARUNI, UDOYON, ASHMITA, ANNAPURNA, DODHICHI, NILACHAL, etc.

The College was initially affiliated to Guwahati University and in 1994, it came under the affiliation of Assam University, Silchar. It is also registered under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act 1956.

On 16th September 2004, a new glorious chapter in the history of Ramkrishna Nagar College was opened. On that day, the college was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, autonomous institution of the UGC, Govt. of India, for 5 years. The college earned the distinction of Grade 'B' scoring 73.05% of accreditation. Presently, the re-accreditation process is in progress.

The founder Principal of the college was Late Shishir Ranjan Kar Shastri, a versatile man with great knowledge and wide understanding. By taking up the noble cause of spreading the light of education to the people of this remote area, he has rendered an invaluable service to mankind.

SOME DO'S AND DON'TS

- (a) Attend a minimum 75% of class lectures delivered in each subject as prescribed by the H.S. Council/A.U.S. to avoid being treated as a non-collegiate/dis-collegiate.
- (b) No entry to the college without identity card and proper College Uniform.
- (c) Never carry mobile phone to the college.
- (d) Keep the college clean and green.
- (e) Maintain discipline, reflect your culture.
- (f) Don't litter on the corridors and use the dustbins.

ADMISSION PROCESS:

Admission to H.S.(Arts) and T.D.C.(Arts & Science) courses for this session will be held in **Online Mode**. This is subject to the approval of the Admission Committee of the college. The Admission Committee sets the guidelines for admission into different classes and streams and there by reserves the right to accept or reject any admission form. However, a certain percentage of seats in all streams and courses are reserved for SC/ST/OBS/MOBC, as per Govt. Reservation Policy.

***The following mechanisms have been suggested by the Admission Committee for admission in different courses:**

PASS COURSE: Recommendation of the concerned department taking into the academic records of the candidates.

HONOURS COURSE: Recommendation of the concerned department on the basis of the academic records and personal interview of the candidates.

- **Admission will be given on the basis of availability of the seat capacity of respective departments.**
- **For admission, preference will be given to the students who have completed their H.S. Course in regular mode.**
- **Undertaking from parents/guardians in regard to admission is compulsory.**
- **The decision of the Admission Committee in relation to the admission matter is final.**

***ADMISSION will be offered strictly on merit basis. However, any change with regard to the admission criteria will be notified in accordance with the time to time order of the State Government and parent University.**

Our college is all set to implement NEP 2020 from the session 2023-24 for UG courses following the guidelines prepared by the affiliating university, that is, Assam university, Silchar. Accordingly, the admission committee is geared up with basic information of implementation of NEP 2020.

Primary Guidelines for implementation of NEP 2020 for UG Courses of colleges affiliated to Assam University, Silchar:

Guidelines for Four Year Undergraduate (UG) Programme as per National Education Policy-2020

- UG curriculum framework shall be a Four Year UG programme (FYUG) as per curriculum structure provided in ANNEXURE-I. Students may choose FYUG programme either with Honours or Honours with research in concerned discipline. After successful completion of six semesters (3rd Year) of study in chosen discipline, students will have the option to opt honours in concerned discipline. If student chooses honours with research option in 4th year, then the qualifying criterion is that he /she should obtain minimum 7.5 CGPA upto 3rd year with no arrear papers. For only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. **But students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to 4th year in any case.** Students opting for research project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline

Specific core papers in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree.

- The colleges shall have the liberty to implement Honours with Research depending upon their infrastructural limitation.
- In the present system, total credit requirement across eight semesters is 160 of which Discipline Specific Core (DSC) – 80, Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) – 34, Interdisciplinary Course (IDC) – 9, Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) – 8, Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) – 9, Internship – 2, Value Added Course (VAC) – 6, Research Project/ Dissertation/ Additional 03 courses DSC – 12.
- Interdisciplinary courses shall have 04 baskets – Natural Sciences (NS), Social Science (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM) which can be opted by students as per their requirements.
- Having the benefit of lateral entry and exit, if student exits after three years then the total credit requirement for Three Years Undergraduate (TYUG) Programme will be 120 of which Discipline Specific Core (DSC) – 60, Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) – 26, Interdisciplinary Course (IDC) – 9, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) – 8, Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) – 9, Internship – 2, Value Added Course (VAC) – 6.
- If a student exits after completion of Semester II (i.e., 1st year), obtaining 40 credits, then he/she can obtain his/her Certificate in the relevant discipline from the university.
- If a student exits after completion of Semesters IV (i.e., 2nd year), obtaining 80 credits, then the university will provide him/her Diploma in the relevant discipline.
- If a student exits after completion of Semester VI (i.e., 3rd year), obtaining 120 credits, then the university will provide him/her Three Years UG Degree in the relevant discipline.
- In our college, following departments will offer FYUG programme (Honours only/ Honours with Research) - English, Bengali, Sanskrit,

Hindi, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Economics, Sociology, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry.

- As per the guidelines, to opt DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-III. Both DSC and DSM should be selected from the same cluster. Same subject cannot be selected as DSC and DSM. DSC from one cluster and DSM from another cluster are not allowed.
- Students shall have to opt for two DSM, one as first minor and the other as second minor. Each such subject should be of 50% of total credit allotted to this course. To cite an example, for Three Year UG Programme, each DSM shall be of 13 credits and for Four Year UG Programme, each DSM shall be of 17 credits. For DSM, students shall have to take two subjects related to his /her Discipline from the same cluster as of DSC.
- If a student secures highest CGPA (above 6.0) without any back paper, he or she shall be allowed to change his or her core course only once after completion of second semester. However, if a student desires to change one of his/her minors to core paper, then automatic change in the minor should be done as the same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
- A student, desiring to opt Honours with Research Degree in 4th year, should obtain 7.5 CGPA upto 3rd year without any arrear paper. However, there shall not be any restriction of CGPA for only Honours degree.
- For Inter-Disciplinary Course (IDC), a student has to opt any one subject from the bunching of Natural Science/Social Science/ Humanities/ Commerce and Management (ANNEXURE -II) **other than DSC and DSM subject**. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters.
- SEC shall have to be opted either from DSC or from DSM 1 i.e., first minor.

- If a student opts one literature as DSC, he/she cannot opt other literatures as DSM and IDC. In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student.
